KEY TAKEAWAYS

KEYNOTE: WHAT NEXT FOR THE ECONOMY?

- **Uncertainty at record highs**: The global economy faces its most uncertain period on record, surpassing even Brexit and Covid-19, with geopolitical tension and new trade tariffs fuelling risk.
- Moderate growth, uneven impact: modest GDP growth of ~3% is forecast for 2025, the US remains relatively insulated, while UK and EU markets face headwinds from tariffs, energy volatility and limited fiscal room.
- Risks and opportunities for firms: UK firms face cost pressures from inflation and hybrid-driven commercial property weakness, yet opportunities are emerging in public spending, green investment and defence.





LEADERS PANEL: THE FUTURE OF THE KNOWLEDGE FUNCTION IN THE AI-ENABLED FIRM

- Knowledge at the heart of AI change: quality knowledge and data are the fuel that power AI tools and a key differentiator for firms embracing Copilot and other emerging platforms.
- Evolving skills and structures: As the role of the PSL and knowledge lawyer shifts, new capabilities like data literacy, tech fluency and the ability to critically assess AI tools are becoming essential across KM teams.
- Adapting culture and mindset: Knowledge leaders must lead by example in driving AI adoption, maintaining clean data and taxonomy, and supporting practitioners as they transition to new ways of working alongside AI.

TRAVERS SMITH CASE STUDY: THE ROLE OF KNOWLEDGE IN TURBO-CHARGING HOW LAWYERS SELL

- From chaos to collaboration: Travers Smith transformed its fragmented knowledge sharing into a structured, firmwide initiative through its *Need to Know* intranet, designed to unite teams and drive collaboration.
- Al-driven and lawyer-led: The platform curates over 150 topic areas using Al for research, summarisation and content freshness helping lawyers easily access and contribute valuable insight.
- Embedding knowledge in firm strategy: By aligning the hub with wider MBD goals and promoting departmental ownership, the firm has made knowledge an active, business-enabling resource rather than a passive archive.






IN CONVERSATION: APPROACHES TO TRAINING THE GENAL GENERATION OF LAWYERS

- Balancing digital and human skills: Firms are rethinking training to pair AI capability with critical thinking, judgement, and communication skills essential for client trust.
- Al as a learning tool: Platforms like Freshfields' Al Academy and Browne Jacobson's Al-driven drafting training are helping lawyers learn by analysing and validating machine-generated work.
- Future-proofing legal talent: Embedding AI literacy alongside "human" skills such as empathy, collaboration and confidence ensures the next generation of lawyers can thrive in a hybrid future.




